

Free resources and websites to assist with home and remote learning

1. TWINKL

They are offering a month's free membership and even if you don't fancy that, there's also free Home Learning Packs for Early Years, KS1, KS2, KS3, GCSE and SEND to download - ALL FOR FREE.

Twinkl has thousands of downloadable worksheets and resources for all age groups. There's also Twinkl Go! for interactive content, Twinkl Originals books and a Parent's Hub for online games and homework help.

2. EDSHED

EdShed is the home for Maths Shed, Spelling Shed, Literacy Shed and Literacy Shed Plus - all amazing platforms that are used in schools.

They offer free 14-day-trials all year round, but at the moment are extending their free trials for the duration of the school closures.

Children can even use the online platform to play with their friends and there's a clever app for Android, iPad or iPhone. For parents wanting to get their own subscription - prices are around £30 per year for each 'Shed'. Great value!

<u>3. IXL</u>

One of the best things about IXL is the fact that all year groups have topics and sub-topics which are really clearly displayed. You can focus one skill set at just the click of a button through online, interactive questions. There's even online rewards for motivating your children!


4. BBC BITESIZE

There are three main sections, Primary, Secondary and Post-16 and I've used all of them for whole class teaching and one-to-one tuition lessons - it's on an easy-to-use platform and offers all subjects. A no-brainer - if you're a complete beginner and have no idea where to start, start here.

5. DUOLINGO

This is a must for learning a new language - it's FREE (always has been) and has a handy app

They offer interactive activities many languages - the usual school options - French, Spanish, German etc.. but also High Valyrian, Greek, Danish and Hawaiian, if you fancied a change!





6. 2SIMPLE

Another great online learning platform, which usually comes at a price. The creators of Purple Mash and Serial Mash are offering schools free access.

Purple Mash is home to clever online tools for children to engage in story creation, game design and art. It also has activities for maths, spelling and grammar and cross-curricular project work. It's well worth a look!

7. 123 HOMESCHOOL4ME

If you need access to free worksheets and activities, here's another good place to start. Our friends in the USA have made a really valuable platform here. You'll need to convert the year groups though!

As a rough guide:

Reception/Early Years --> Pre-Kindergarten

- Year 1 --> Kindergarten
- Year 2 --> 1st Grade
- Year 3 --> 2nd Grade
- Year 4 --> 3rd Grade
- Year 5 --> 4th Grade
- Year 6 --> 5th Grade

8. WALKABOUTS (by ActivEd)

Aimed at children up to Year 3, Walkabouts offer interactive videos whereby children get up and move whilst learning. It's interactive, fun and at the moment - FREE!

It's a US site, so just remember to do the conversion for the year groups but it's all relevant and entertaining to use.



9. BODDLE

Boddle offers interactive maths games for children in primary and early secondary school. It's for Grades 1-6 (US) which is Reception to Year 7 for UK schools.





10. CLASSROOM SECRETS KIDS

Classroom Secrets Kids is offering FREE access. The platform is aimed at primary aged children and covers subjects such as maths, reading, grammar and spelling.

The platform is really child-friendly so that they're able to access it on their own. There's load of games and interactive activities from phonics to SATs - definitely worth a look!

11. VOOKS

Vooks is a site full of beautifully animated story books. Great as a hook or starter for a writing task or just to enjoy! It's a US site, so you'll need those handy conversions again.

12. SENECA

Suitable for KS2 children, right up to A-Level, Seneca is a FREE learning platform - you don't need to join, you can begin learning straight away. There is a paid section for premium resources.

Seneca covers every subject and is easy to follow.

13. TWIG EDUCATION

Suitable for children in primary school, Twig is a wonderful website dedicated to science. The kind people at Twig are offering FREE ACCESS to their online learning materials such as videos, activities and worksheets. Many of their videos are also available in Spanish.

All you need to do is sign up for free access via their website.

14. OXFORD OWL - (we already have usernames and passwords for this)

Oxford Owl for Home is a bright and colourful website with free resources available to download without registering. Aimed at primary aged children, they offer activities for reading, English, mathematics and interactive games. There's also handy 'How To' videos, to explain tricky concepts.



15. NATIONAL GEOGRAPHIC KIDS

National Geographic Kids is a great platform for learning and it's totally FREE. There's online games, resources and competitions too. Aimed at primary aged children, there are a wide range of subjects - history, science, geography, English, Maths, Art & Design and PSHE.

At the moment TTS are offering FREE home learning booklets for primary children and they're great. They are split into three categories - Early Years, KS1 and KS2.

17. VERSO LEARNING

Verso learning has a huge focus on gaining student feedback, it also has pre-created activities, filtered by age and topic, so help you build your own lessons for your children. There's also a handy activity builder if you want to create your own.

18. WORLD GEOGRAPHY GAMES

This completely FREE online gaming platform is great for learning about geography topics. There are interactive activities on continents, capitals, flags, regions, islands, rivers... the list is endless.

There's no subscription or free trial, just go to the website and play!

19. BEANSTALK

Beanstalk has your little ones covered and offers interactive learning material for children aged 1 to 6. (Pre-nursery through to Reception)

During the COVID-19 threat, they are offering full access for FREE. They offer live classes and 'on demand' classes.

20. GETEPIC

A really useful website which reads books to children. Free subscription needed but this then links to Accelerated Reader and you can filter by AR quizzes etc.

21. ONCEUPONAPICTURE


Brilliant for creating vivid images in children's minds for story writing or to provoke imagination.


