




PE/Sport Premium Report 2022 – 2023



Primary PE and Sport Premium - Key Indicators
Schools must use the funding to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE and sport they offer. There are 5 key indicators that schools should expect to see improvement across:
The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity - the Chief Medical Officer guidelines recommend that all children and young people aged 5 to 18 engage in at least 60 minutes of physical activity a day, of which 30 minutes should be in school

Key achievements to date until July 2022:	Areas for further improvement and baseline evidence of need:
 Our Year 6, Year 5 and Year3/4 football teams have been successful and we were particularly proud of our girl's football team, who showed real grit and determination throughout their competitions. We had increasing numbers of participation in sports clubs and the Friday dance session on the playground was over-subscribed. We maintained our Silver award for the School Games Mark and are now working towards Gold. Teachers have received CPD from a Sports Coach during their class PE lessons. All staff have reported increased levels of confidence as a result of this. Playtime and lunchtime resourcing has improved. Part of the playground has been re-laid and we have a bank of resources available for pupils to use at lunchtimes. The forest school area has been developed and has been used on a weekly basis during the Summer term by all classes. Staff received outdoor learning training and have made clear links to the current curriculum, rather than it being an 'add on'. We have had our most successful swimming year to date. 	 New PE curriculum/fact files need further embedding, together with the use of the Depth of Learning framework to assess and identify gaps in learning/skills. Support staff need further training on playtimes and lunchtime games to increase their confidence in engaging all pupils during these times. Review staff training to ensure staff feel confident in teaching and use the sports coach to enable this.
